Happy 10th birthday to Dolly Parton's Imagination Library of Floyd County! We have lots to celebrate! Over the past decade Imagination Library delivered 396,163 books to 14,548 children in our community. New Albany-Floyd County Education Foundation is grateful to our generous funding partners for providing funds that keep these high-quality, free books coming each month to the mailboxes of our local families. The Horseshoe Foundation of Southern Indiana, an original and ongoing partner, has contributed a total of \$495,000 to date. 2019 partners include Metro United Way, Samtec and PNC as well as numerous individual donors. With an annual book budget of \$96,000, our community has illustrated its commitment to our children's reading success.

\$25,000 IN GREAT CLASSROOM PROJECT FUNDS AWARDED TO TEACHERS IN SEPTEMBER, \$16,800 IN OCTOBER, \$767,000 TO DATE!

In September the NAFC Education Foundation approved \$25,000 in Great Classroom Project funding to 34 teachers. In October we approved \$6,800 to 23 teachers in Floyd County Schools. <u>We have funded over</u> <u>\$766,000 in resources in our 9th year of this program!</u> Great Classroom funding opportunities are available to teachers who may apply for funding of up to \$500 for a Great Classroom Project. These projects are used to provide additional resources to creative teachers for learning opportunities that enhance the educational and curricular objectives of their classrooms. 
