Each family member has their own special recollection of their time here, and how it's impacted their trajectory in life. Meet the Wilson/McMonigle family!

Charles "David" Wilson (FCHS'71) was a freshman at Floyd Central for its inaugural opening during the 1966/1967 school year. He remembers the thennew school as a co-mingling of people and personalities that was 'groundbreaking' for everyone. He fondly recalls athletics at Floyd Central, marked by spirited pep rallies—including during the run of the "Superhicks" to the final four—and his time as a Turkey Bowl cheerleader. Life after FCHS has been a storied one for David. His accomplishments include becoming the president of Charlie Wilson's Appliance, TV & Mattresses, and driving 19 laps at Daytona International Speedway! David stays connected to NAFCS through the family business, his church, and of course, by attending various basketball games and athletic events still today.
