Great Classroom Projects

DURING THE 2013-2014 SCHOOL YEAR, AMERICAN TEACHERS SPENT \$1.6 BILLION OF THEIR OWN MONEY ON CLASSROOM SUPPLIES AND TEACHING MATERIALS.

We know the exceptional educators in NAFC schools give all they can to make sure their students succeed. To help them along in their efforts, we are proud to offer the opportunity for any educator in the district to apply for up to \$500 a year in Great Classroom Project funding. These projects are used to provide additional resources to creative teachers for learning opportunities that enhance the educational and curricular objectives of their classrooms.

Examples of past projects funded are:

- Yoga mats for yoga instruction and training in Health and PE
- Books and audio recordings for students with special needs
- Frogs for dissecting in science classrooms
- Printing Press for art rooms
- CD based foreign language learning system
- Water basketball goals for health and fitness training
- Web based learning plans for students with disabilities
- Interactive technology like iPads and document cameras
- Music books, music stands, and interactive SMART Board software for music rooms

In the 2013-2014 school year the Foundation funded \$75,000 in Great Classroom Projects. In only four years The Education Foundation has funded over \$280,000 in resources to over 600 teachers!

Imagination Library

Since 2009, each month children under the age of five in our community have found a free, personally addressed, age appropriate book tucked in their home mailboxes. Imagination Library reaches over 3,000 young children monthly—serving more youth than any other single program in our county! With more books in the home, all families tend to read more with their children. The enclosed reading tips share strategies that parents can use to develop early reading skills such as letter identification and playing with letter sounds. Having books in the home is a significant factor in helping families establish a culture of learning long before their children enter school.

Currently over 100 local businesses, organizations, churches, and agencies promote this program to their customers, clients, members and employees by distributing registration brochures. Floyd Memorial Hospital assures that our newest citizens get an early start in reading by signing up newborns as they are discharged from the hospital. Thanks to NAFC Education Foundation, we are well on our way to both the premise and promise of Imagination Library of Floyd County: to create the next generation of successful readers!



Junior Achievement


Junior Achievement of Kentuckiana is the region's leading provider of life-changing economics programs for students. In recent years students have demonstrated an alarming decrease in their understanding of basic economic principles.

Additionally, employers report widespread decline in basic employment skills and government reports give further evidence of the diminishing ability among young people to manage personal finances. To combat this struggle, the Education Foundation is committed to sending all 5th and 7th grade students in the NAFC school system to a Junior Achievement interactive classroom every year.

During the 2013-2014 school year, the entire 5th grade student body, about 950 students, participated in Junior Achievement's BizTown and the entire 7th grade student body, about 925 students, participated in JA Finance Park through funding from the Education Foundation.

JA BizTown is a creative hands-on program designed to respond to employer and community leader concerns that students lacked the basic understanding of the economics and life skills needed for future roles in the workplace. The program combines a four-week classroom curriculum with a state-of-the-art interactive free enterprise laboratory located in Louisville. The JA BizTown experience helps students learn and apply rigorous academic standards in math, civics, social studies, language arts and technology as 5th grade students play real life roles as citizens of their very own mini town.

JA Finance Park is a month-long economics education program that introduces personal financial planning and career exploration to 8th grade students. Classroom teachers deliver financial literacy basics during a four-week period, then students visit JA Finance Park to put into practice what they've learned about economic options and the principles of budgeting. Assisted by their teachers and a staff of trained volunteers, they have the opportunity to actually develop and commit to a personal budget.

Our 2nd annual Pigs 4 NAFC Kids fundraising project was a success! 40 piggy banks designed and painted by local artists of all ages were on display throughout Floyd County businesses to raise funds and awareness for NAFC schools through the Education Foundation. All proceeds helped to fund classroom resources through the NAFC Education Foundation. Additionally, the pigs were auctioned off at the Education Foundation's annual dinner/auction, the Education Celebration! on March 14th, 2014.

International Baccalaureate

Floyd Central and New Albany High Schools are prestigiously joining the handful of Indiana schools to offer an International Baccalaureate diploma for next school year. These two schools will be among only 22 in the state of Indiana, and the only high schools offering the programme south of Indianapolis.



The International Baccalaureate Programme offers students the opportunity to obtain collegiate credits while requiring a rigorous six courses of study including areas of languages, social studies, the experimental sciences, mathematics, and world languages. The diploma-track, which students begin their junior year, requires more than finding right answers and passing exams. Students compose a 4,000-word thesis on a subject of their choosing with the guidance of a faculty advisor, as well as complete 250 hours of community or other service between their junior and senior years. Students in the programme also complete a theory of knowledge course that requires them to not only stand on what they know, but gives them the ability to back up why they know a given subject.

New Albany and Floyd Central High Schools will receive worldwide recognition while providing students graduating with an IB diploma many opportunities for college enrollment and scholarships. This accreditation was made possible by a generous grant from the Blue Sky Foundation.



Scholarships

The NAFC Education Foundation was honored to award their second annual college scholarships to four graduating seniors. Savannah Wormley and Bailey Hussung from Floyd Central High School and Maria Johnson and Cloe Motley from New Albany High School all received \$1,000 toward college tuition. 
