"Julie Conrad, speech therapist at Mt. Tabor says: This approach was a huge success with all of our students. Students were very engaged in the lessons and we not only worked on their communication goals, but integrated literacy skills, ISTAR standards, state standards, and other academic areas. We have received a lot of positive feedback on the integrated classroom lessons from the special education teachers. These lessons gave us the opportunity to model therapy techniques for the teachers and teachers' aide so they could continue to work on students' speech and language skills when we are not in the classroom. We have students who were non-verbal at the beginning of the year now producing a few words and students who did not have a way to communicate that are now exchanging pictures to request toys and items in the classroom. Since this approach was so successful and the feedback was extremely positive, we plan to continue to implement the same type of program next year for our speech students."
