Great Classroom Project Update: Where Are They Now?

The Education Foundation awarded the New Albany High School Science Department (NASD) Great Classroom Project funding for a mobile iPad computer lab. The funding allowed the department to purchase a secure cart, a wireless access hub, and accessories allowing 300 students to utilize the interactive technology. Since the purchase of the mobile lab, students have used iPads in a variety of ways including biology webquests, and Keynote presentations. Mr. Moreland and Ms. Anderson report "student engagement and lesson interest have both increased. Students are on task a much higher percentage of class time." Since the installation, the NASD has completed over 90 different research projects on the stars. Congratulations to the NASD on their Great Classroom Project funding and for their achievements in the classroom!
