Registration forms are available at the New Albany-Floyd County Public Library, distributed through NAFC Schools, Head Start, Hispanic Ministries of Southern Indiana, Indiana University Southeast, Success By Six, child care homes and centers, churches and many community organizations and businesses. The annual cost of one child's participation in Imagination Library is \$30. A whole month of books for all registered children is approximately \$6,000.
